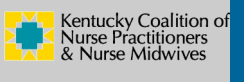

- Recognize the difference between acute pain and chronic pain
- Explain what Opiate-induced Hyperalgesia is and how to recognize it
- Discuss the real risks of long-term opiates
- Report the costs to society associated with long-term opiates
- Review alternatives for medical and non-medication management of chronic pain
