

Dear Colleague,

We are aware of the frustration many practices have with providing certain vaccines to Medicare patients. While vaccines such as Fluzone and Pneumovax are covered under Medicare Part B, other products like Shingles (Zostavax) and Tdap (Adacel) are covered under Part D. Since Medicare Part D is for prescription drug coverage, physicians typically cannot bill for these services.

To help you address this issue, we are pleased to announce our affiliation with TransactRx. With the TransactRx program, you will be able to provide vaccines like Zostavax (which is available from Merck) and Adacel (from Sanofi) to your Medicare patients covered under Part D and receive:

- Easy online access to patient specific coverage
- Ability to get fairly reimbursed for vaccines covered under Part D
- Real-time out-of-pocket (copay) cost and reimbursement information
- Electronic claims submission for vaccines covered under Part D

TransactRx connects to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) database in real time to first determine if your patient is enrolled in a Medicare Part D plan. If enrolled, TransactRx works with most Part D plans and provides you with the patient out-of-pocket cost and your total reimbursement so you confidently provide the vaccine(s) at the time of service.
