Purpose & Objective

Mild to Moderate Atopic Dermatitis: Pathogenesis and Targeted Therapies for Improved Outcomes

After completing this activity, participants should be able to:

- Identify the pathogenesis of the skin barrier dysfunction in AD
- Describe how skin barrier dysfunction and inflammatory responses are related
- Elucidate the inflammatory/immunomodulating pathways in AD
- Evaluate the safety/efficacy of current and emerging therapies, their targets in the pathogenesis of AD, and their roles/potential roles in treating AD

Tackling HFrEF With Novel Therapies and Guideline-Recommended Care

After completing this activity, participants should be able to:

- Describe guideline-recommended risk assessment and evidence-based, holistic management of patients with HFrEF
- Compare the efficacy and safety of newly approved and traditional therapies for treating specific types of patients with HFrEF
- Incorporate into practice multidisciplinary team initiatives that can improve transitions of care for patients with HF.

Coordinating Care in IBD: Diagnosis and Co-Management Strategies for Family Physicians

After completing this activity, participants should be able to:

- Identify diagnostic tools and physical exam, patient history, and work-up components that can be used to determine which patients are suspected with IBD need a gastroenterologist referral for further evaluation
- Outline the therapies available for the management of IBD, the disease severity they are recommended for, and their adverse effects
- Implement screening strategies to address the preventive care and health maintenance needs of their patients with IBD

DOT Medical Examiners Course

After completing this activity, participants should be able to:

- Perform driver medical exams and to understand fully the medical standards of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR) and related guidance. The National Registry requires medical examiners to participate in required training, pass a certification test, and register on the National Registry System to become a certified medical examiner. Certified medical examiners agree to keep their National Registry accounts up to date (license, training records, etc.) and to transmit at least monthly results of all CMV driver exams performed to FMCSA via the National Registry System. To become a Certified Medical Examiner you must: Be licensed, certified, or registered in accordance with applicable State laws and regulations to perform physical examinations. Register on the National Registry System and receive your unique identifier number. Complete required training and pass the medical examiner certification test. Maintain certification by completing periodic training every five years and recertify by passing the ME certification exam every 10 years.
